



CONGRATULATIONS SIMEON!

The Huskies organization would like to congratulate former Huskie, **Simeon Rottier**, for being drafted as **#1 overall**, by the **Hamilton Tiger Cats**.

Former All Canadian Huskie drafted 1st 2009 CFL Draft.

At 6'6", 285 lbs. Simeon Rottier, a native of Westlock, AB was named Prairie Football Conference Offensive Lineman of the Year in 2005, while a member of the Edmonton Huskies. This past Saturday, in the **2009 CFL Canadian Draft**, the Hamilton Tiger-Cats selected Rottier **1st overall**.

"We're ecstatic to add an outstanding Canadian prospect like Simeon," said general manager Bob O'Billovich. "He's a tremendously talented player with a great attitude and was our primary target during the entire draft process. He will be a great addition to our offensive line."

Rottier, the second cousin of former Edmonton Eskimos centre and Edmonton Huskie, Tim Prinsen, never played high school football and spent two years on the sideline with the Huskies before finally getting on the field, midway through his third season. Originally a tight end, he moved to the offensive line during 2004, when a spot opened up due to an injury. He helped the Huskies win their first national title in 40 years that season. He emerged as a star and a team leader for Coach Mike McLean's squad, as they won a second straight national title the following season.
